Early in December 2018 I received the following inquiry – 'Cecil. Do you have any info about 'Redeemer Central' church in Belfast?' In my response to the inquirer, and having visited the church web site on http://redeemercentral.com/ I made a number of points including the following –


- 1. They have a quote that reads 'theology too is a conversation' that sounded to me like 'emergent' thinking.
- 2. One of their regular speakers is Ryan Hawthorne who 'specialises' in **Spiritual Formation**. My good friend Gary Gilley has written extensively on this (he has a good book called 'Out of Formation') but you can access his thoughts on this link https://tottministries.org/spiritual-formation/
- 3. The nearest to a 'Basis of Faith' is their web page setting out The Apostles and Nicene creeds.
- 4. They refer to '101 prayer' and state it is 'centred round the eucharist' definitely language that would appeal to Roman Catholics as would their 'table meetings' where they give this quote 'every table is an altar'.
- 5. For study they are using a book called 'The Good and Beautiful God' by James Bryan Smith. He is involved with Renovare founded by Richard Foster that basically promotes mysticism. Peter Rollins: I have previously written on 2 occasions about Mr Rollins and these articles can be accessed on http://www.takeheed.info/reflections-on-emergingikon/ and http://www.takeheed.info/peter-rollins-of-ikon-is-about-to-emerge-inamerica/ Mr Rollins is a close friend of Rob Bell who, having been moved on from the church where he was pastor in Michigan, due mainly to his book 'Love Wins' that really promoted the heresy of 'Universalism', (see this helpful review on https://tottministries.org/love-wins-universalisms-new-champion/) has carved out a new career including appearing on TV with Oprah Winfrey and appearing in a night club as a comedian. In June 2018 he gave a newspaper interview and you can read what he said by going to https://www.churchtimes.co.uk/articles/2018/15-june/features/features/heresyholiness-and-oprah-rob-bell-interviewed Sadly, Peter Rollins still plies his strange philosophies around the world, whether online or in person (including Northern Ireland) as can be seen by current events listed on https://peterrollins.com/calendar/ Clearly Rob Bell and Peter Rollins are well suited to each other's philosophies.

Alain Emerson: Mr Emerson is pastor of Emmanuel Church in Lurgan and he has experienced real and deep grief when after only months of marriage he then had to nurse his wife Lindsay through cancer which eventually took her life. He subsequently published a book called 'Luminous Dark' and he gave a talk by the same title in Redeemer Central on 8th April 2018. I am conscious that this must have been an unbelievably painful experience for this young man and would not wish in any way to minimise his arief. This link goes the talk he gave https://www.buzzsprout.com/10218/680409 and as you will read Mr Emerson has "a passion to see God do a new thing in Ireland" - unfortunately that "new thing" includes 'false ecumenism' and 'things charismatic' (a duo that often go hand in hand). The online ministry 'Protestant Revival' has documented much of this ecumenical and charismatic activity as you can read by going to this link https://protestantrevival.wordpress.com/tag/emmanuel-church/ As you will read the author of these reports often employs a different approach to the subject matter from that of myself but nonetheless the factual information contained in the various reports gives a solid basis for warning people to steer well clear of Mr Emerson.

Paul & Priscilla Reid: Paul Reid was the founding pastor of the Christian Fellowship Church (CFC) on the Hollywood Road in Belfast and his wife Priscilla also served in an eldership capacity. Like Emmanuel Church in Lurgan, CFC was heavily involved in 'false ecumenism' and 'things charismatic' promoting people on the 'charismatic front' such as John Wimber, Gerald Coates and Ken Gott and on the 'ecumenical front' people like Paddy Monaghan (of the so-called 'Evangelical Catholic Initiative) and the 'Evangelicals & Catholics Together In Ireland' booklet published in July 1998. I will now include images of the front cover of the booklet and also the page giving details of the Group Participants that include well-known and high-profile figures in the ecumenical movement from both Roman Catholic and supposed Protestant backgrounds. I should point out that Pat Collins, Donal Godfrey and Paschal Scallon, although referred to as 'Rev', are in fact Roman Catholic priests.



Conclusion

We cannot know what the Lord of history has in store for the Third Millennium. We do know that His promise is sure. We know that we are enlisted together in His service.
